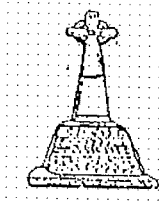

ON TUESDAY 8 SEPTEMBER AT TANYFRON COMMUNITY CENTRE.

The minutes of the meeting of the 14 July 2009 were confirmed as a true record and
signed by the Chairman.

2. POLICING

PCSO Camplin said that issues had been raised with regards to the diversion through
Bwlchgwyn. A letter from Cllr Tilston was read out by the Chairman which noted the
concerns of the residents. The letter called for a special meeting to be arranged in
order to discuss the matter further. Cllr B Woodfine-Jones would arrange this with all
Bwlchgwyn councillors, residents and the police.

PCSO Camplin said that the situation was being monitored carefully by the police and
that the increased volume of traffic was actually reducing the speed of drivers. The
Chairman noted Cllr Tilston's concerns.

PCSO Gemma Hellyn told the meeting that she would be leaving her post and Cllr B Stapley wished her well in her new position.

3. CAMBRIAN HOUSE

Cllr Monti told the Council that a report had been published and he would like to invite all Councillors to a meeting taking place on the 15 October at the Enterprise Centre Brymbo. All Councillors needed to be aware of the developments with regards to Cambrian House. A copy of the report would be circulated to Councillors before the meeting.

4. COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCILLORS REPORTS

Cllr Rogers said that 2 planning applications on Blast Road had been granted. He asked whether the Community Council would consider cutting back the trees on the Red Path as they were severely affecting the lights. Residents were having difficulties there and he had received complaints. He proposed that the Community Council pay up to £1000 to have the trees cut back. Cllr B Stapley seconded and it was agreed that the Community Council would fund this up to £1000.00.

Cllr Rogers said that Bryn y Ffynnon play area had been identified as needing 2 new pieces of equipment. WCBC were willing to match fund up to a value of £2500.00 Cllr Williams said that the play area was well used. Cllr Monti proposed and Cllr Woodfine-Jones seconded that Brymbo Community Council would match fund up to £2500.00 for the 2 pieces needed. Cllr Rogers asked that signs were put up horse riders at Cae Merfyn and it was agreed that this would come out of the Brymbo Environmental fund at a cost of approximately £200.00



CLLR B STAPLEY DECLARED AN INTEREST AND SIGNED THE
APPROPRIATE FORM.

A donation request had been sent from Brymbo Luncheon Club requesting financial assistance with the insurance of the bus. A letter had been received by the Clerk before the meeting started and was read out by the Chairman. The letter was from a resident who was concerned that the bus was not a community bus and was being used as a personal convenience. A letter had also been received from Martin Matthias Headteacher of St. Mary's Aided primary school and had been previously circulated to each Cllr, thanking the Community Council for the support of the bus which transported children to the Clwyd Special Riding Centre for the disabled in Llanfynydd. Cllr Davies said that the mini bus was a Community bus and was



available to any group in the Community as long as a permit was held to cover that particular group. Cllr Monti said that he hadn't realised until then that it was a community facility. Cllr Rogers said that he had received complaints from residents who had seen the bus around the village at times when the Luncheon Club was not running and asked for it to be minuted that the residents' concerns, regarding usage were noted. It was suggested that signage be placed on the bus advertising the fact that it was a community facility and residents would be aware that groups in the area could therefore use it when needed. With regard to the request for a donation to pay the cost of the insurance, Cllr Rogers asked whether the Luncheon Club was financially sustainable and would it be possible to have a breakdown of costs and usage. Cllr Monti said that comparisons were needed and a further discussion should take place regarding the funding. Cllr Ashton proposed that the Community Council should cover the cost of the insurance at £1340.00 as it was due in the next few weeks and monitor the use of the bus. Cllr A Stapley seconded this and it was agreed that the insurance premium would be paid and the situation be monitored and also placed on the Agenda for further discussion.

13. CAB FUNDING

An invoice had been received from Wrexham CAB with regards to Community Outreach Funding. The invoice was for £3028.94 and a general enquiries total was 89. It was agreed that before a decision on funding was made the Community Council should have a more detailed report. The Clerk was to write to Gaynor Roberts asking for this, or if she preferred she would be welcome to attend the next meeting to discuss the service.

14. STREETSCENE

Cllr B Stapley said that the style on footpath no 26 needed attention.

15. WATERSIDE WAY

CLLR K MONTI DECLARED AN INTEREST AS CHAIRMAN OF BRYMBO SPORTS DEVELOPMENTS AND SIGNED THE APPROPRIATE FORM


Estimated costs for the repairs at Waterside Way were given as approximately £700 for the Sports Association and £400 for the Angling Club. Cllr Rogers moved that the Community Council pay the full cost of repairing the fencing and this was unanimously agreed.

16. COLLECTION FOR D MORAN AND D GREENWAY

Cllr B Stapley asked Councillors whether they would like to make a donation towards a collection for the above retired Councillors. This was agreed and would be done during the meeting.

17. STREET LIGHTING MAINTENANCE CONTRACT

A letter had been sent to the Clerk and circulated to all Councillors prior to the meeting from Paul Fairclough at WCBC. It said that the Borough Council had



entered into a term maintenance contract for the street lighting stock until 2014 and would like to know if Brymbo Community Council would like them to manage their street lighting stock. It was unanimously agreed that the Community Council would like to remain with NWP Power as it was very happy with the service provided.

18. MUGA AT TANYFRON

Cllr Rogers said that informal quotes had been received for the MUGA. He proposed that the contract for the MUGA should be put out to formal tender with funding from the capital reserves. This was seconded by Cllr B Stapley and agreed unanimously.


